I have experienced every type of abuse but I still see the good in people. Now, I can see the good in myself. When I first came to The Life Link I didn't care about myself. But now I know I matter.

I learned to ground myself early on. I used to have panic attacks all day. These days I stop and breathe and realize where I'm at. In therapy I have been shown that my feelings are real and should be accepted. I have "my team" at The Life Link. No one judges you. I am accepted for who I am. They helped me with housing. They helped me with a dentist. The support systems are incredible. PTSD is not going to win. I am going to win and I'm doing it. I have bad days but now I know I can get through them. I have gone from numb to I can do this.

I'm proud of myself for coming this far. And for being me. And I really do matter.



# **Housing Services**

The Life Link believes stable, permanent housing is essential for people to become integral members of a community. We are a community leader in advocacy for the improvement of supportive housing and coordinated behavioral health services for the citizens of New Mexico. We are the largest provider of permanent housing for formerly homeless individuals and families in our region.

#### **PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING & LA LUZ**

Chronically homeless individuals and families with disability. The most vulnerable in our community.

#### **LINKAGES**

Homeless or precariously housed with Serious Mental Illness (SMI).

#### **RAPID REHOUSING**

Homeless families and individuals with low barriers. Provided help with deposit, rent assistance, and utilities for up to 11 months.

#### **HOMELESS PREVENTION**

At risk of homelessness through court eviction, past due on rent and rent assistance if needed for up to 11 months. Also covers utilities.

# **Human Trafficking Aftercare**

The Life Link's Anti-Human Trafficking Initiative is New Mexico's only comprehensive aftercare program for victims of human trafficking. We work through partnerships with state government, law enforcement, community stakeholders, healthcare providers, and other crisis response organizations.



#### The Human Trafficking Aftercare team has:

- ~ Worked comprehensively with 185 victims
- ~Connected with 816 unique individuals through our 505-GET-FREE human trafficking hotline.
- ~Partnered with the Homeland Security Blue Campaign to outreach to the Native American and homeless youth communities which led to 5750 visits to our website.



In November 2020 in the depths of the COVID pandemic, the HT Aftercare team joined a collaborative effort with FBI, Homeland Security, DEA, EPA, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Navajo police, Sheriff's Department, and various other local law enforcement agencies to directly support displaced Chinese immigrants and others who were rescued from a labor trafficking operation in northwest New Mexico. These individuals were found to be in poor medical and emotional health, left with no homes, no resources, and little besides the clothes on their backs. With The Life Link's assistance, the victims were able to obtain housing, emergency funds, medical care, payment for lost wages, and additional resources to begin the long process of rebuilding their lives. Since the rescue operation, we have continued working with these immigrants in California to connect them to resources there, and some have chosen to move to New Mexico to receive the ongoing support of our team.



# **Homeless Outreach Services**

Our Homeless Outreach Team meets people where they are at including encampments, on the streets and at overnight shelters to provide support and information about services at The Life Link. Support also includes providing supplies, food and clothing.

### Analyn Schwaegel aka "Bagel" and the Re-Entry Program



Bagel works at The Santa Fe County Adult Correctional Facility as part of the Re-Entry Program. As a County funded Navigator, she works with individuals to help them find housing, help get an ID or birth certificate so they can look for a job, or even to get to rehab if necessary. Bagel provides much needed transportation and a plan as the jail won't release someone unless they have a place to go. Bagel helps individuals move their life forward.



"I'm super happy that I help people connect with what they need when they get out. I feel passionate about this population and I'm grateful I have a relationship with the jail and can network and try to build a bridge for people. It's also nice to know that my past has been a benefit for others and helps me be more relatable. I can honestly say 'I have been in your shoes'. I am a 3x convicted felon and now I have a good job. I can provide hope that you can turn your life around.".



# **Peer Support**

Peer support workers are people who have been successful in the recovery process and who help others experiencing similar situations. Through shared understanding, respect, and mutual empowerment, peer support workers help people become and stay engaged in the recovery process and reduce the likelihood of relapse. Peer support services effectively extends the reach of treatment beyond the clinical setting into the everyday environment of those seeking a successful, sustained recovery process.
